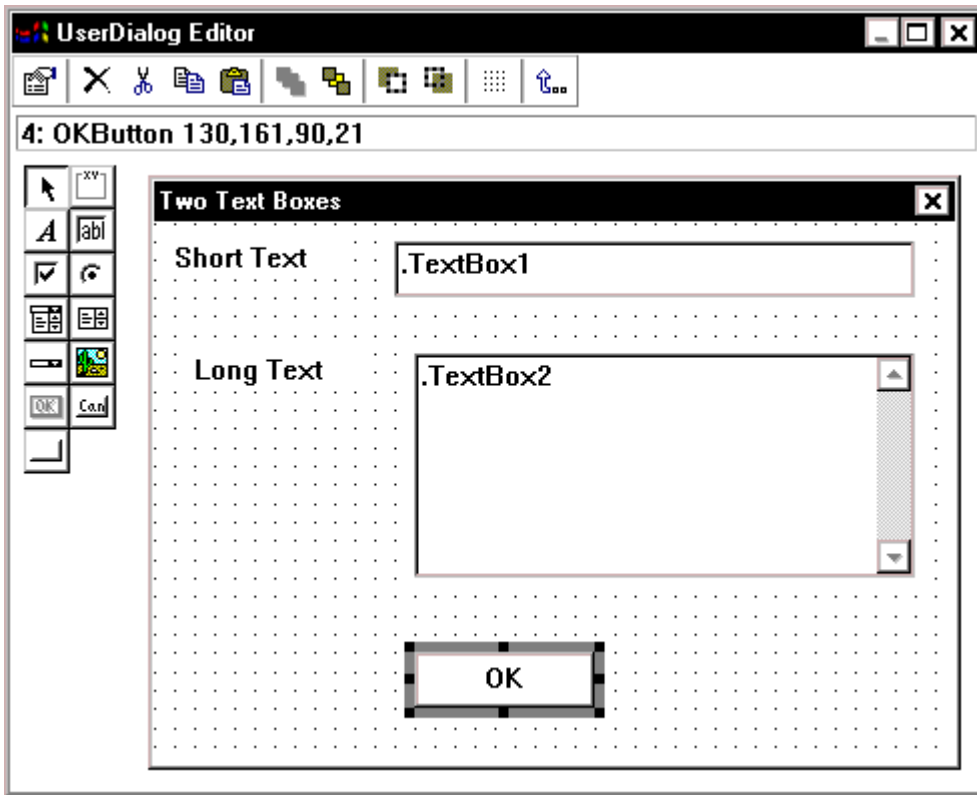

To finish this simple form, click on the “OK” button. Then position the cursor where you’d like an “OK” button to be on your form. Click, and you should see an “OK” button.



Then close the UserDialog Editor window. When asked if you wish to save the UserDialog, answer “Yes”.

This returns you to the MyCommands Editor box. Several lines of code are inserted into your script. They define the size, type, and attributes of the form you just created. Don’t try to over-analyze them.
